





The Dynamic Parenting Program for parents is an interactive program and was designed to enhance parenting skills and thereby strengthen family relationships. The program was initiated by Sathya Sai Baba with the noble aim of helping parents to better understand their inherent values and guide them to inculcate the same in their children. It is based upon the integration of five universal human values of Truth, Right Conduct, Peace, Love, and Nonviolence.

At Sathya Sai School, the attendance in parenting program is mandatory. It's offered by the Canadian Institute of Sathya Sai Education. The program consists of 10 modules, for ten weeks, two hours each session. In December 2023, there were two batches of workshops at the school, and we are now pleased to showcase some of the pictures taken during the graduation held on 9th December. Feedback received from the parents is always encouraging, and the program is offered at no charge to parents.

The Institute has a plan to start another parenting workshops in April 2024.
